Take a look at what a web page looks like " behind the scenes. "

- 1.) Look along the top of your browser screen
- 2.) Find the word VIEW
- 3.) Use the mouse to point at the word VIEW
- 4.) Pull down the menu and select SOURCE
- 5.) Like the mandala, after you look at the layout of the tags used to create a simple web page, you'll be able to recognize patterns that help to unlock the secrets of how web pages work.

- 6.) Look along the top of your browser screen
- 7.) Find the word FILE
- 8.) Use the mouse to point at the word FILE
- 9.) Pull down the menu and select SAVE AS
- 10.) Make sure you are saving to the desktop
- 11.) Leave the defaults set as NAME **stem.htm**, TYPE **.txt**, ENCODING **ansi**

To see how your web page will look on the screen, you can view it through your web browser (i. e. Internet Explorer) Take a look at what your web page looks like while you work:

- 12.) Look along the top of your browser screen
- 13.) Find the word FILE
- 14.) Use the mouse to point at the word FILE
- 15.) Pull down the menu and select OPEN
- 16.) Use the mouse to click on the word BROWSE
- 17.) In the rectangle next to the words **Look in:** select desktop
