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Electronic Reserves (ERes) is a library service that allows instructors to post articles online for their students to access. ERes is accessible from any internet connection but requires a course-specific password.

Your instructor will supply the ERes password for your course. When you receive your password you can write it on the line below. You are responsible for keeping the course password secure. Use of the course password by anyone that is not in your course could be a breach of U.S. Copyright Law.
