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The above, compared with the list of last year, shows a net increase of nine vessels, and 1380.67 tons. This increase is in the schooners, there being a falling off in the number and tonnage of the boats, which consequently increases the average tonnage.

Gloucester Harbor has had thirty-three new schooners, and seven schooners and four boats from other places, added to its list; while six schooners have been lost at sea, and sixteen schooners and seven boats have been sold to other places—leaving a net increase of fifteen in the whole number. Annisquam has added two new schooners and one new sloop, and four schooners and one boat from other places, to its list, while four schooners and three boats have been sold to other ports—making a net income of one to its fleet. Rockport has added one new schooner, and three schooners and three boats from other ports, to its list, while three schooners and one sloop have been lost, four schooners

and three boats have gone to other places, and two schooners have been condemned—making a net loss of six vessels to its fleet, while the aggregate tonnage is slightly decreased. Essex still retains its one schooner, but Manchester has reduced one-third of its number, one of its schooners having been sold to Gloucester Harbor.

A revision of the List shows that there is not a square rigged vessel among the whole number; and that a large preponderance of the 506 schooners were built at Essex. Of the whole number, 288 (more than half) were built at Essex; 60 at Gloucester, (which includes Annisquam); 18 at Kennebunk, Me.; 18 at Bath, Me.; 16 at Boothbay, Me.; 14 at Salisbury; 10 at Bristol, Me.; 9 at Chelsea; 8 at Boston; 5 at Danversport; 5 at Middletown, Ct.; 4 at Newburyport; at Newbury and Wells, Me., 3 each; at Manchester, Rockport and Ipswich, 1 each; and the balance of 41 at different places from Maine to Maryland.

## FISHING FIRMS AND ESTABLISHMENTS.

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The above, compared with the list of last year, shows a net increase of nine vessels, and 1380.67 tons. This increase is in the schooners, there being a falling off in the number and tonnage of the boats, which consequently increases the average tonnage.

Gloucester Harbor has had thirty-three new schooners, and seven schooners and four boats from other places, added to its list; while six schooners have been lost at sea, and sixteen schooners and seven boats have been sold to other places—leaving a net increase of fifteen in the whole number. Annisquam has added two new schooners and one new sloop, and four schooners and one boat from other places, to its list, while four schooners and three boats have been sold to other ports—making a net income of one to its fleet. Rockport has added one new schooner, and three schooners and three boats from other ports, to its list, while three schooners and one sloop have been lost, four schooners

and three boats have gone to other places, and two schooners have been condemned—making a net loss of six vessels to its fleet, while the aggregate tonnage is slightly decreased. Essex still retains its one schooner, but Manchester has reduced one-third of its number, one of its schooners having been sold to Gloucester Harbor.

A revision of the List shows that there is not a square rigged vessel among the whole number; and that a large preponderance of the 506 schooners were built at Essex. Of the whole number, 288 (more than half) were built at Essex; 60 at Gloucester, (which includes Annisquam); 18 at Kennebunk, Me.; 18 at Bath, Me.; 16 at Boothbay, Me.; 14 at Salisbury; 10 at Bristol, Me.; 9 at Chelsea; 8 at Boston; 5 at Danversport; 5 at Middletown, Ct.; 4 at Newburyport; at Newbury and Wells, Me., 3 each; at Manchester, Rockport and Ipswich, 1 each; and the balance of 41 at different places from Maine to Maryland.
