Our figures this year still show a reduction in the number of vessels and aggregate tonnage in this District, although not so large as in the List of 1879. The fisheries were always among the last branches of business to feel the effect of the "boom" when a revival takes place throughout the country; and when we take into consideration the dangerous nature of some of the fisheries, the competition which the British Provinces furnish, and the encouragement which the latter receive from Massachusetts merchants, the wonder is the reduction is not larger every season.

The List for 1880 is made up to September 12th; and we find that during the year last past, five new Schooners and five new Boats, with nine Schooners and six Boats from other Districts, have been enrolled in the District of Gloucester. Nine Schooners and two Boats have been lost or wrecked at sea, and twenty-three Schooners, one Steamer, two Sloops, and three Boats have been sold out of the District. The aggregate number of vessels in the District is fifteen less than last year, and the net reduction of tonnage is 1,334.29 tons.

LOSSES.

The losses from the District during the past year have been light compared with those of the previous year; although the loss of four vessels, with their entire crews of fifty-two men, would in previous years have been considered disastrous. The whole number of vessels lost from the District was eleven — nine schooners and two boats, — of an aggregate tonnage of 603.82 tons. Eight of the schooners were of an aggregate value of \$26,587, on which there was insurance to the amount of \$24,187. The outfits on seven of these schooners were insured for \$5100.

The following are the vessels which have been lost from the District since the publication of our 1879 List :

Sch. ANDREW LEIGHTON, 83.56 tons; built at Gloucester in 1875. This vessel sailed Oct. 21st, 1879, for La Have Bank, and was last seen on the 29th, the day of the severe gale, when, it is supposed, she foundered with all on board. Her crew consisted of Oscar W. Alden, master, Andrew McDonald, William Brown, Oscar Wistar, Frank Nelson, Martin Hogan, Charles Berg, Martin Strahan, Adolph Nelson, Frank Veaneau, Frank Flake, all sin-

gle men; John Boudrot, left a widow and two children; Andrew Olsen, a widow in this city; Henry Johnson, a widow and one child in Boston—fourteen men in all. The schooner belonged to Messrs. Cunningham & Thompson; was valued at \$4797, and was insured by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company for \$4198, with \$1500 on the outfits.

Sch. ANNIE C. NORWOOD, 60.05 tons; built at Boothbay, Me., in 1871. This vessel sailed on a haddocking trip March 20th, 1880, and was last seen on the 23d, near Cashes' Shoal, off Massachusetts Bay. There were fourteen men on board, as follows:—Joseph M. Hurst, master, of Kittery, Me., unmarried; Joseph Garrett, leaves a widow; William Isaac, William Fardy, David Roberts, and Patrick Neal, each a widow and three children; James Anderson, George Crawford, William Holland, Charles Higgins, Thomas Orne, Lawrence Nelson, and Charles Armstrong, each single; and Edward W. Wilson, of Clinton, Conn. The schooner belonged to Messrs. George Norwood & Son; was valued at \$2810, and was insured for that amount by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company, with \$500 on outfits.

Sch. CARRIE F. BUTLER, 68.35 tons; built at Newburyport in 1867. This vessel was wrecked at Rustico, P. E. I., during the gale of Oct. 29th, 1879, and became a total loss, the crew saving themselves with difficulty. She belonged to Mr. William Parsons, and was valued at \$2700. There was insurance on the vessel for \$1500 by the Gloucester Fire Insurance Company, and \$800 by the Atlantic Insurance Company of Provincetown. There were 300 barrels of mackerel on-board the vessel when wrecked.

Sch. HARVEY C. MACKAY, 64.77 tons; built at Essex in 1866. Sailed Aug. 28th, 1879, for a salt trip of four months on the banks. She was obliged to wait a month for bait in the Bay of St. Lawrence, and was last seen October 29th, the day on which a terrific gale occurred, during which she undoubtedly foundered. The crew consisted of Frank Nolan, of Gloucester, master; George Holly, of Rockport; Augustus Campbell, Everett Campbell, Frank Hobbs, Fred. Crowell, and a young man named Morton, of Argyle, N. S.; W. H. Bartlett, of Maine, married; William Higgins, and Charles W. Hunt. The vessel belonged to Messrs. William Parsons, 2d, & Co., and was valued at \$2595. There was \$2271 insurance on the vessel, and \$800 on the outfits, by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company.

Boat HARP, 10.88 tons. This vessel ran ashore on Green Island Reef, near Portland, Me., March 27, 1880, and sunk in about twenty minutes. She was owned by Messrs. W. N. Mace and Wm. P. Dennis, of this city, and was engaged in the herring fishery from Eastport, under command of Hiram Arey.

Sch. JUNO, (of Rockport,) 47.81 tons. Was wrecked at Provincetown in February, 1880, and was afterwards sold for \$25.

Sch. N. H. PHILLIPS, 66.93 tons; built at Gloucester in 1870. This vessel sailed for Bank Quero, Oct. 7th, 1879, and was last seen the day before the severe gale of Oct. 29th, when it is supposed she foundered. There were fourteen men on board, most of them from the British Provinces. William McDonald, master, left a widow and two children; John McKinnon, widow and one child; Albion Bowden, widow and two children; John Welch, widow and five children,—of this city; John McDonald, Charles Crawler, and Neal McDonald, natives of Canso; Michael McInnis, Cape George, N. S.; John Steel, Prince Edward Island; John and Richard Tobin, (brothers,) Guysboro, N. S.; Duncan McIsaac, Cape Breton; Clifton Thomas, Union,

Me., and one other, whose name was not given. The N. H. Phillips belonged to Messrs. Walen & Allen; was valued at \$3270, and was insured by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company for \$2862, with \$1000 on outfits.

Boat NUMBER ONE, 12.62 tons.

Sch. OCEAN BELLE, 67.02 tons; built at Bath, Me., in 1869. She sprang a leak on George's Bank, March 26, 1880, and sank after being stripped by the crew, who were brought into port by the sch. Adelia Hartwell. The Ocean Belle belonged to Mr. Sylvanus Smith, was valued at \$2692, and was insured by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company for that amount. There was also \$300 insurance on the outfits by the same office.

Sch. O. S. BAILEY, 58.22 tons; built at Newburyport in 1878. She belonged to Messrs. Hardy, McKenzie & Co., of Gloucester, and Hardy Brothers of Newburyport, and was abandoned at sea Nov. 22d, 1879, while homeward bound from a freighting trip to Dominica, in the West Indies, with a load of fruit. The schooner was valued at \$4553, and was insured by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company for \$3984 with \$400 on outfits.

Sch. WINIFRED J. KING, 63.61 tons; built at Bath, Me., 1876. This vessel was wrecked at Brace's Cove, Eastern Point, on the morning of Feb. 3d, 1880, and soon afterwards went to pieces in the storm of that day. The crew were saved. The vessel was employed in the shore winter fishing, belonged to Capt. John King, and was valued at \$3870. She was insured by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company for the same amount, with \$600 on outfits.
