In again making our appearance, and thus laying before the public in a tabular and condensed form the names of the different classes of vessels which are enrolled in the District of Gloucester, with their lengths, breadths, depths, tonnage, official numbers and letters, names of places where and dates when built, with the names of their masters and owners or fitters, we have the satisfaction of presenting an increased number of vessels and aggregate of tonnage compared with last year. This increase shows that the fishing business of last year was a profitable one, and also shows that Gloucester harbor continues to be the centre of the fishing business, and the principal port of the whole country in which that business is carried on. It is *the* business of the place, as all branches of other kinds of traffic carried on here are subsidiary to and entirely dependent upon that business. And it seems to be so firmly established in Gloucester, and diversified into so many different branches, that the season must indeed be a hard one that will retard the growth and prosperity of the city. There have been years of depression, when it appeared to many that a death blow had been given to our place; still we have continued to go on increasing and enlarging, and now we seem to have a position, that if one or two branches of the business should in any one year fail, the other branches will sustain the whole, and we shall continue to go on prospering and to prosper in a business point of view.

Another matter of congratulation, and it is the prayer of the compiler of this work that it might always be so, is the fact that we can account for every vessel published in our List of last year, and that we are not called on to place upon our pages the fact that any vessel belonging to this district has sailed from our port and never been heard from afterward. Previous Lists have contained pages devoted to this unpleasant record of vessels and crews, but this present List will be entirely free from any such enumeration. It is unprecedented, we think, since we commenced the publication of the Lists of Vessels.

The number of new fishing vessels added to the List the past year, forty-four to Gloucester Harbor, and three to Rockport, is the largest, we believe, added in any one year. They aggregate 3889.35 tons, and average 82.54 tons. In the List of 1868, we added the names of thirty-seven new fishing vessels, aggregating 2349.82 tons, and averaging 63.51 tons. This shows that the vessels built now for the fishing business are thirty per cent., or nearly one-third, larger than those built fifteen years ago for the same business.

In making other comparisons between the List of the present year and that of 1868, we find the fishing business more concentrated in Gloucester Harbor now than then. The singular fact is presented that the number of schooners now belonging to Gloucester Harbor, three hundred and ninety-one (391), is just the same as in 1868, but the tonnage is increased 6,725.73 tons, or nearly one-third. The number of (51) boats now enrolled as belonging to Gloucester Harbor is more than double the number (23) enrolled in 1868; but the average tonnage now (11.32) is a little less than in 1868

(13.50.) One yacht, four small steam vessels, and one sloop have been added to the Gloucester Harbor fleet, making the aggregate number of (449) vessels thirty-four more now than the number (415) in 1868, and the tonnage has increased 7,245.99 tons, within a few figures of exactly one-third.

But while Gloucester Harbor has been gaining in aggregate tonnage, the other sections of the District have been losing since 1868. Rockport has now just one-half the number of schooners she had in 1868, when she had fifty (50), but the falling off in their tonnage is but about one-third; she has one less sloop, but the tonnage of the present nine is larger than then; and there is an increase of four boats with a larger per cent. of their tonnage. The aggregate of the two years shows a loss of twenty-two vessels (31 per cent.), and 579.20 tons (21 per cent.)

Annisquam shows now but eight vessels and 338.78 tons, when in 1868 there were thirty-eight vessels and 1191.81 tons. Essex has now no vessels enrolled in this District, and there is but one boat of 5.07 tons hailing from Manchester now. There were two schooners enrolled from Manchester, and the same number from Essex in 1868.

The aggregate of the present List compared with that of 1868, shows twenty-one (21) less number of vessels and 5,516.87 more tons enrolled in the District.

One hundred and twenty-eight of the vessels named in the List of 1868 are given in this present List, most of them having remained in the district the whole time, while a few have been away and returned again.

By a law passed at the last session of Congress, an amendment was made to the tonnage act, by which in the measurement of vessels an allowance is made for the space occupied as cabins for the crews, and in steam vessels for the space occupied by their boilers and engines; this allowance, however, was not to exceed five per cent. of the gross tonnage of sailing vessels, and fifty per cent. of that of steamers. As this allowance has been made on all vessels whose papers have been presented at the Custom House since the law went into force, while there are many whose papers are still out, we have been obliged to make two tonnage columns, gross and net, in the pages of this List. Our computations, however, are all based on the gross tonnage, as we could make no comparisons with previous Lists if the two tonnages were in any way mixed.

The present List is made up to the first of August, 1883, and shows an aggregate of five hundred and eight (508) vessels, and 31,674.64 tons, which is a net increase of twenty vessels and 2504.10 tons, over the aggregate given in our List of last year. The following is the statement of the vessels, tonnage, and average tonnage, as compiled in this List:—

The fancy for naming vessels after living individuals is fully illustrated in the above list, as twenty-five are the names of females, and eighteen the names of men, leaving only eight that are designated otherways. This fancy is no doubt pleasing and complimentary to the individuals whose names are adopted; but after all, is not the custom of using a double name of any kind a questionable one, for in the use of the name by those employed on and about the vessels a portion of it is frequently dropped, more especially where the name is a long one.

The losses from our District the last year, we are greatly pleased to say, have been unusually light, and comprise only five vessels—four schooners and one boat, of an aggregate tonnage of 249.68 tons. They all belong to Gloucester Harbor, and are as follows:—

Sch. ALICE G. WONSON, 64.18 tons, built at Gloucester in 1870. She was engaged in haddocking on George's Bank, and while going into Boston harbor, March 6, 1883, with a trip of 70,000 lbs. of haddock, she struck on Harding's Ledge and bilged. The crew were taken off by one of the Boston pilot boats. The vessel belonged to Mr. William H. Perkins, Jr., and others, was valued at \$5000, and was insured by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company for \$3000, with \$500 on outfits. The materials saved from the wreck were sold in Gloucester for about \$400. The hull of the vessel was afterwards burnt on Bird Island flats to get it out of the way of navigation.

Sch. CORINNA H. BISHOP, 81.61 tons; built at Essex in 1875. She was engaged in haddock fishing, and was lost at Shelburne, N. S., December 11, 1882. She belonged to George Dennis and others, was valued at \$5000, and there was an insurance of \$4470 by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company.

Boat HANNAH, 8.59 tons.

Sch. MADAWASKA MAID, 63.06 tons; built at Bath, Me., in 1868. Lost on Bunker's Ledge, Mt. Desert, February 12, 1883, while returning to Gloucester from Eastport with a full cargo of herring. The crew were saved. The vessel belonged to the master, Joseph I. Tupper, and with her cargo was valued at \$5000. There was \$2920 insurance on the vessel and \$1080 on the cargo by the Gloucester Mutual Fishing Insurance Company.

Sch. PLANET, 32.84 tons; built at Essex in 1845. She was run into and sunk off Seguin, Me., September 21, 1882, by an eastern bound steamer. The captain and four men, after pumping for four hours, had to take to the boat, and were picked up by sch. Wildfire and landed at Portland. The schooner belonged to the master, John Haffey, and there was \$800 insurance on her.

List of New Vessels

ADDED TO THE GLOUCESTER FLEET IN 1883.

Notwithstanding the heavy losses in the Gloucester fisheries last year—17 vessels, 1119 27 tons—there was a substantial increase of our fishing tonnage during the year, the number of new vessels built and added to the fishing fleet being larger than for any other year since 1875, namely, 46 vessels, aggregating 3635.07 tons. The additions of new vessels annually since 1875, inclusive, have been as follows: 1875,—48 vessels, 3881.23 tons; 1876,—27 vessels, 1925.07 tons; 1877,—32 vessels, 2456.55 tons; 1878,—12 vessels, 410.51 tons; 1879,—4 vessels, 325 tons; 1880,—5 vessels, 335.90 tons; 1881,—17 vessels, 1179.62 tons; 1882,—43 vessels, 3647.94 tons.
